The TTAC and the CAC have both recommended approval of these TIP Amendments.

-Highway Performance Measures-Please find enclosed with the agenda packet correspondence from State Highway Engineer Aaron Gillespie documenting the West Virginia Department of Transportation's targets for the five federally required performance measures. The area's covered by these performance measures are interstate highway pavement condition, bridge conditions, Interstate and Non-interstate performance, freight movement, and traffic congestion and on-road mobile source emissions for the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) program. The attached documentation explains the State's goals for this program.

It is Staff's recommendation that the MPO adopt the State's goals initially and that the MPO monitor practices for performance monitoring nationwide to determine if the MPO would like to adopt different standards in the future. The Technical Advisory has recommend adoption of the Staff recommendation. The Citizens Advisory Committee recommends that the Policy Board withhold adoption of the Performance Measures pending the provision of more information on how the data is collected for the performance measures and how they will be reflected in the planning and programming process.

-Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan Request for Proposals-Policy Board members may recall that the MPO's Unified Planning Work Program calls for MPO staff to conduct an update of the Urban Area's pedestrian plan during the current fiscal year and an update of the bicycle plan during the upcoming

fiscal year. As mentioned at the last Policy Board meeting, the recent pedestrian safety initiative jointly sponsored by WVDOH District 4, WVU, the City of Morgantown and the MMMPO has led to an understanding that the bicycle and pedestrian planning effort should be significantly intensified to create a much more comprehensive plan for these modes of transportation than a staff led update of existing plans could accomplish.

MPO staff has been working with WVDOH, WVU, the City of Morgantown and the Bicycle and Pedestrian Boards to develop a request for qualifications to develop a more comprehensive project. Please find attached the draft request for qualifications developed for this study.

MPO Staff has discussed the funding of this project with WVDOH and it is anticipated that there will be approximately \$175,000 to \$200,000 available Federal funding for 80% of the cost of this project. WVDOH will provide 10% of the cost of the project. This will require the MPO to provide a 10% match as well. Depending on the cost negotiated with the consultant selected for this project, this will amount to between \$17,500 and \$20,000. Staff has been in touch with Granville, Westover, WVU and the City of Morgantown concerning the local match required for this Study. Each entity has expressed a willingness to consider providing a portion of the match. Please find below one possible formula based on population for dividing the required funding between these entities.
